- 1. Monthly Numbers (109 CFS, 32 Traffic Stops, 12 Citations)
- 2. Accreditation Grant- We are putting in for an accreditation grant through the federal government by June 4. This grant will be used for necessary renovations and purchases we already completed, and also many additional purchases that would make our agency compliant with the accreditation standards.
- 3. Training Grant-Our agency is putting in for a training grant through MCOLES. We will use this grant to create an autism awareness training and program. We are currently partnering with the Oxford Center to bring in the director, therapists, and head of security to assist with the training and scenarios. The goal of this training will be to offer training to other agencies to help with autism response and agencies set up an autism awareness program. This will assist their officers with responding to children with special needs and providing them with resources to be successful. The grant will pay for training supplies, part-time officer salaries, salaries of Oxford staff, and other necessary equipment that will be needed to complete this training. We are also looking at providing sensory bags that will be put together with the direction of the Oxford Center staff.



Recitals

WHEREAS, the Village of Stockbridge (hereinafter, the "Village") has adopted the Village of Stockbridge Zoning and Land Use Ordinance (hereinafter the Zoning Ordinance) on October 1, 2019, which was adopted under the *Zoning Enabling Act of 2006*; and

WHEREAS, the Village President, the Planning Commission, determined text amendments were Warranted to said ordinances in order to amend text of Article IV, Zoning District Regulations, Chapter 6, Section 6-70: Purposes and Uses within Zoning Districts. Paragraph (CBD) Central Business District and in Paragraph (C-3) Highway Commercial. To make the ordinance accurate and more user friendly, while still maintaining the Historic quality of the village.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission met on February 15, 2024, to develop a revision to the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, during this process the Planning Commission Chair requested changes to zoning ordinance text specifically Section, 6-70, Paragraph titled: Central Business District, (CBD) permitted uses and to Paragraph titled: Highway Commercial (C-3) Special uses.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission is therefore charged with coming up with the proposed language of the text amendment and then scheduling a public hearing to take public comment on the proposed amendment, pursuant to Section 6-329 (a) of the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has determined, via this amendment, proposed text Located in Section 6-70-Purposes and uses within zoning districts Amend text of Article IV, Zoning District Regulations, Chapter 6, Section 6-70: Purposes and Uses within Zoning Districts. Paragraph (CBD) Central Business District and in Paragraph (C-3) Highway Commercial.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission proposed to consider the language of proposed Amendments and set a public hearing for text Amendment to ordinance,

a. For 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 07, 2024, for Section 6-70-Purposes and uses within zoning districts(f):(C-3) Highway Commercial, (3) Permitted uses and (4) Special Uses. Notices were given in the methods proscribed by MCL 125.3103 and MCL 125.3202;

WHEREAS, after taking into consideration the public's comments, Section 6-329 (b) of the Zoning Ordinance required the Planning Commission to identify and evaluate all factors relevant to the petition and report its findings and recommendation to the Village Council, taking into consideration the criteria for amendments of the official Zoning Ordinance set forth in Section 6-331 of the Zoning Ordinance.

WHEREAS, all costs the Village incurs in developing these amendments shall be charged to the Planning Commission account, Village of Stockbridge, in accordance with Article III, Section 6.47, including the actual costs incurred by the Village, the Planning Commission, and/or the Zoning Administrator for:

- A. Any publication or mailing costs required by this Ordinance and/or state law;
- B. Any traffic reports deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- C. Any legal services deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- D. Any planner fees deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- E. Any zoning administrator fees deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- F. Any topographic studies deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- G. Any engineering services deemed necessary to complete the processing of the request;
- H. Any other fees incurred by any other consultants deemed necessary by the abovenamed governmental officials and/or entities to complete the processing of the request.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission, after taking into account the input from the public hearings set forth above, in accordance the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Enabling Act, considering the criteria of Section 6-331 (a) - (h), recommended adoption of the proposed text amendments to Section 6-70-Purposes and uses within zoning districts Amend text of Article IV, Zoning District Regulations, Chapter 6, Section 6-70: Purposes and Uses within Zoning Districts. Paragraph (CBD) Central Business District and in Paragraph (C-3) Highway Commercial.

- 1. **Paragraph:** d CBD: amend Paragraph 4: Permitted uses text by adding; j Pool Hall/Billiard Hall without alcohol being served or allowed on premises.
- 2. Paragraph: f C-3 amend, Paragraph 4 Special Uses (g) to read:
 - g. Recreation and amusement services, including theatres, bowling alleys, roller- and ice-skating rinks, billiard halls that serve alcohol and miniature golf.
- **SECTION 2:** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Village of Stockbridge declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsections, sentences, clauses, and phrases be declared unconstitutional.
- **SECTION 3:** That this Ordinance and the related rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders, and matters established shall take effect immediately upon publication, except any penalty provisions which shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication, pursuant to MCL66.1.
- **SECTION 4:** Repealer All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed only to the extent necessary to give all provisions of this Ordinance full effect.

RE: Technology Proposal

Our department has gotten the official word that we will be moving into our newly renovated building in the front of SAESA within the next few weeks. This past year, I grew this agency by over 500%, and I was able to promote one of our officers to Sergeant allowing our department to operate more efficiently. This newly renovated space will include an office for the chief of police, a sergeant office, a patrol area suitable for multiple officers, male and female locker rooms, and a training room. I am submitting this proposal for a two-desktop purchase, that should be available around the same time as our departmental move, to more adequately fit our agency.

This two-computer purchase will better accommodate our six-officer department. Multiple times a week, Sergeant King, Officer Smith, and I have overlapping shifts at the same time, and we currently only have two computers available to use. There have been multiple occasions where we all have been working on cases or the same case, and one officer had to wait to finish his report or review video. This cuts down on efficiency and proactive patrol time within the village. This two-computer purchase will allow the chief of police and sergeant to have their own computers in their office opening the officer's computer for patrol staff.

This past year, we were able to purchase a labeling system for our evidence and property through our report system company, Premier One. This system cuts down on paper trails and allows for better tracking of evidence and easier audits. This system allows us to stay within our property and evidence standards for accreditation.. This system is currently only operational with the chief of police computer. With this purchase, we will move this computer to the new evidence processing room. This will allow our officers to quickly and efficiently log evidence and found property into our report system and secure the evidence in lockers faster. This will also cut down on officers bringing potentially fatal narcotics into our main office area and will allow officers to have better justification to our chain of custody on the stand.

This two-computer purchase is also necessary to give our supervisors the ability to perform supervisory duties such as accreditation tasks, internal investigations, report reviews, scheduling of staff, and other supervisor duties or conversations in their offices away from their subordinates.

To purchase these computers, we will need to purchase through Gracon. I have attached the quote to this proposal. The computers, monitors, and programing came to \$2,083.02. I am coming to the council regarding this purchase, because it is not currently within our budget but is a necessary purchase for our department. There are less than 250 of these units left, and whenever we change the quote due to sold out units, the pricing changes. As you know, we are currently getting closer to our accreditation assessment next spring. This purchase will help us with being compliant and meeting security standards set by the MLEAC. We will have a few more purchases that will need to be made prior to the assessment next year in order to be compliant, but along with this purchase, I currently am applying for grants that would help assist with reimbursement of these purchases. I also have plans for allowing us to apply for more grants in the future, and I would gladly sit down and discuss those with you individually some time soon.

Hi Debbie

I have been in conversations with the State regarding the water and sewer situation and I believe you have a few options. I will lay them out here for you, but I am thinking that once you have had an opportunity to read through them and digest them, a conference call between the 4 of us, might be our best option in determining the best course of action.

Water & Sewer Issue:

1 – Continue to work with BS&A on determining an adequate (and auditable) mechanism for determining which residents owe for unbilled water and sewer services so that a receivable and revenue adjustment can be posted in order to finalize the audit.

Or

2 – Have the Council pass a resolution to forgive the previously unbilled water and sewer bills and move forward ensuring that all current residents were properly and continue to be properly billed each month for services. Because this goes against your Village Ordinance, you would want to get your legal councilor's stamp of approval, but the State believes that since this is such a big issue that stretches back so far, a resolution forgiving the past and moving forward correctly would be acceptable.

Once a decision on this piece is made by council, the next step is determining how to proceed with the audit. We have been unable to complete the audit due to this very material issue; however, after discussions with the State, you have a few options here as well.

Audit Issuance:

- 1 if Option 1 is selected, the audit will continue to be on hold until the water and sewer revenue and receivable is correct. The Act-51 would still be able to be filed, but the F-65 would not be able to be filed until the audit is complete.
- 2- If Option 2 above is selected, the audit could finalize with the revenue numbers where they are at, but a compliance finding would be documented due to not following the Village's Ordinance.
- 3 If option 2 above is chosen, we could go ahead and file the F-65 and Act-51 repots now, without a formal audit report (with findings) being issued. Your village size allows for you to skip an audit year. This would stop additional fees from accruing and allow for the reports to be filed next week. The positive side to the work that has already been done this year is that we are still required to audit "beginning balances" and that has been done, so it would cut down the work for your 2/28/22 audit and would essentially allow the ordinance issue to go unreported in an audit report (assuming the forgiveness happens before your fiscal year ends).

This is definitely a Village Council decision, but in light of the amount of time you have already put into all of this, and with as late as your audit already is, I would recommend Option 2 for the water & sewer issue and Option 3 for the audit issuance. Please review and let me know how you would like to proceed. If you would like to talk through this via a conference call, I will be available tomorrow until 10am and then again on Monday after 10am.
